ACTIVITIES OF THE CITIZENS' ASSOCIATION JULY TO SEPTEMBER 15, 1968

On Saturday, September, Mrs. Rose Kramer and Richmond Keendy, members of the Montgomery County Council, met with 21 local citizens at the home of Don Herdeck. The issues discussed were a county road to replace MacArthur Blvd., a community library and "town hall" center, establishment of a program using County and/or Federal funds to enlarge, repair or improve housing in Cabin John, paving Carver Road, getting more teachers and an enriched program at Clara Barton Elementary School, juvenile delinquency and recreational programs, and towing away of abandoned vehicles and other "junk". Also discussed was jet noise abatement, cleaning up the laundromat property,

maintaining the new sidewalk. The meeting lasted two and one half hours and seemed to have identified, if not solved, some of our pressing problems.

On August 29th, Don Herdeck, President of the Cabin John Citizens' Assn., met with Mr. Coyle of the County Office of Community Development to discuss a housing, library and "town hall" set-up for Cabin John.

Mr. Herdeck met with Homer O. Elseroad and members of his staff on August 24th to discuss community concern over boundary irregularities between Clara Barton School and Carderock Springs School. The meeting with the Superintendent of Schools was amiable but it was made quite clear that the County is not about to reconsider the inclusion of the Caraway-Osage Lane territory in the Carderock School district.

JETS! WHO NEEDS THEM (OVERHEAD!) ?

September 25 will give those angered by the Jet Invasion an opportunity to make their presence and pressure felt at a public hearing hosted by the F.A.A. This is the first and may well be the last opportunity to which the public can avail itself in order to present statements referring to present conditions at National Airport, and the resultant Noise Slum in the Potomac Valley.

Put to the test will be public sentiment regarding the prospect for further developing National's capacity. Specifically, testimony will be presented on the nation's five most congested airports. The solution which will be proposed by the F.A.A. could result in an unlimited number of operations per hour for good weather, and the maximum of 60 under conditions of poor visibility. The operational day will be lengthened by two hours, as well.

Both of these measures will intensify and protract jet noise in the Potomac Valley. Helicopters are currently clanking by in ever increasing numbers over certain routes. The short take-off/landing jets are here for a five week trial period. A new terminal, which we feel is in the offing, will facilitate the advent of the jumbos and airbuses, predicted to be operational in five years' time.

Had enough?

Your presense at the hearing will be effective whether or not you make a statement. September 18 is the deadline for submitting written or oral (signify time required in writing) statements to the F.A.A. the docket will remain open for communications until October 9. Time of the Hearing: September 25th, 9:30 a.m. Place: F.A.A. Headquarters, 800 Independence Ave., S.W. Get together a carload of interested citizens and attend.
