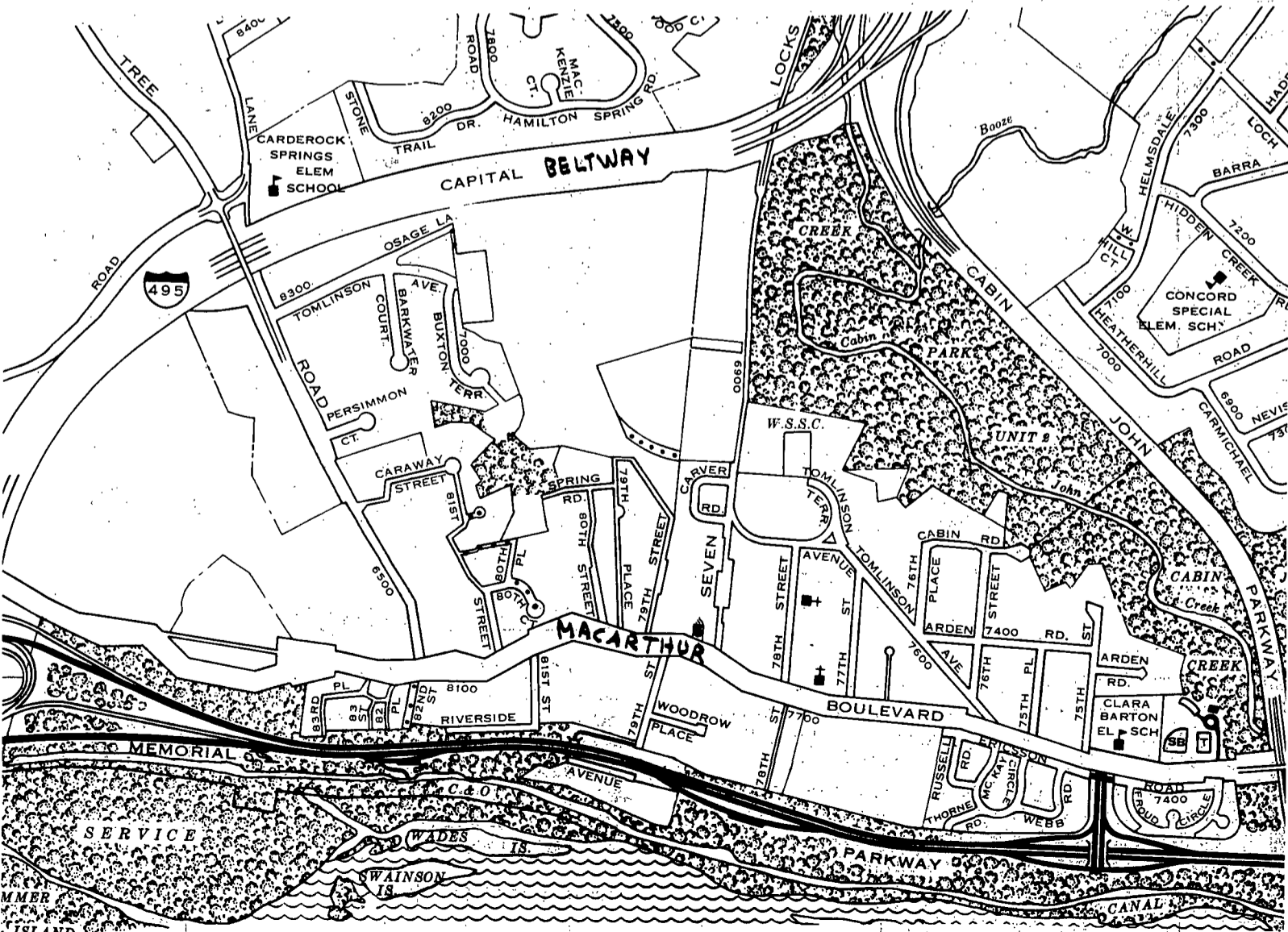
### LOOK BUT DON'T PICK

RECIPE LADIES' FILES

This month our recipe comes from far away Nebraska, but from a lady whom many of you know well. She is Mrs. Frances Iglehart (whose house in Cabin John Burt and Gladys Richardson bought). Mrs. Iglehart has the Village News mailed to her in Nebraska, and she writes: "When the women of Cabin John compile their cook book, I should like to have one of mine in it, so I will send one occasionally. Here is Mrs. Iglehart's recipe for

ADAMS CASSEROLE

- 6-cups crumbled corn bread
- 1/2-tsp poultry seasoning
- 1-tsp celery seeds
- salt and pepper
- 1/2-cup minced onion
- 3-Tbsp snipped parsley
- 1/2-cup melted butter
- 5-cups cooked chicken or turkey, diced
- 1-cup butter
- 1-cup flour
- 1 1/2-tsp salt
- 2-cups chicken broth or bouillon
- 2-eggs, well beaten
- 1-tsp milk.

HOW-To: Preheat oven to 375  
In large bowl, combine corn bread, seasonings, onion, parsley, 1/2-cup butter. Toss together with fork. Spread in layer in baking dish. Arrange chicken over top.

In large skillet, melt 1/2-cup butter; stir in flour, 1 1/2-tsp salt. Stir in broth; heat. Combine eggs and milk; add to sauce; cook until thickened, stirring. Pour sauce over chicken and bake 45-minutes. Serves 8-10.

HINT: I halve this, of course; mix and bake cornbread in large casserole; crumble and use this ONE dish for all "activities". Rather lush, and like fowl with cornbread stuffing. Will freeze well.

PARENTS OF FOUR YEAR OLD CHILDREN  
(born in 1967): There will be a May 17th meeting of all parents on Monday night at 8 pm in the Clara Barton School library to set up the 4 year old program for next year. Anyone - whether already registered at Round-up or not- who is interested in this class must attend this meeting, so that class size and parental support may be ascertained. If too few parents show up there will be no class. Remember May 17, 8pm.

At the April meeting of the Citizens Asso., several topics of general interest were discussed. A pot luck Cabin John Community picnic was proposed for the June meeting. Support was voted for the setting up of a nearer recycling center for glass, newspaper, etc. Mr. Manzane reported that cluster zoning for the Shapiro tract on Persimmon Tree Rd. was approved despite opposition. Another Spring Tour for county officials was deemed a good idea. Appreciation was expressed to the various organizations and individuals who have kept up the attractive garden plots along Mac Arthur Blvd. Janet Hutchinson was named to set up another Cabin John Cleanup Day. Her first report follows.

The Cabin John Citizens Assoc. would like to sponsor another clean-up campaign, within the next month or so, similar to those in years passed. Last year's very successful refuse pick-up day was special in that money was appropriated by the County Council specifically for this purpose. However, refuse collection is no longer the responsibility of the County Council under the new form of government and therefore, last year's action cannot be repeated. There are other alternatives: the citizens of Cabin John can rent or borrow a truck manned by residents to do essentially the same type of pick-up from private homes. The County will supply bags for organizations who wish to pick up litter from public property. However, large items like appliances, bath tubs, water heaters, etc., are the responsibility of the property owner. If a truck and volunteers become available, we may be able to dispose of such items ourselves. The County will remove old cars for a fee of \$7.00 each. If cars or other refuse, large or small, are on vacant land, the office of Licenses and Inspections will contact the property owners demanding that they be removed, if a complaint is filed by phone or letter with their office. If you are interested in donating your ideas and/or services to a clean-up campaign, please call Janet Hutchinson, 365-2144.

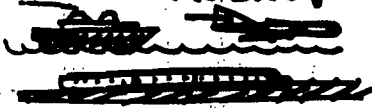

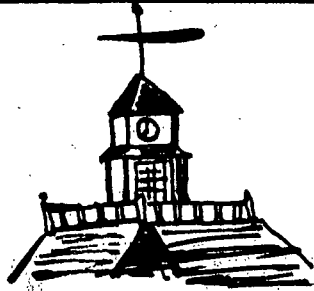
