



### AN OPEN LETTER TO CABIN JOHN

On Thursday evening, September 13, at the Clara Barton School an important public hearing will be held. This hearing represents the first tangible result of the nearly three years of effort by the people of this community on the Cabin John Plan. In most cases, a town plan such as ours is given favorable "lip service" by public officials and agencies, and then stuck in someone's desk drawer to gather dust. Cabin John's plan has passed that hurdle, and this public hearing marks the beginning of strong County action to implement the proposals we made.

A public hearing is held to give all interested citizens a chance to comment on these proposals one more time before they are adopted into the Master Plan of the area. Undoubtedly, some of the developers who own land here will be on hand to argue against our less dense zoning proposals. The issue of including moderate cost housing in Cabin John might be raised again. And, in the case of Tomlinson Avenue, a choice as to its location and/or abandonment will be made on the basis of what is said publically on September 13.

The Cabin John Plan was written by more than sixty people within this community, and was emphatically passed at two Town Meetings this spring. The public hearing is a time to speak in favor of these proposals as well as against. Let's show the County officials that we strongly support the Cabin John Plan, and that we're willing to follow the "talk" in the Plan with "action." Attached to the Village News is a map and description of the content of the public hearing. All these things require zoning changes to make them binding.

The Commercial Center on the Touhey tract is defined as the first two items. Item #3 concerns the vacant land south of MacArthur Boulevard, including the Pollinger tract, and with a R-90 zoning hopes to encourage responsible development in keeping with the rest of Cabin John. Item #4 is the Burgess

Tract. The PUD zoning referred to in the Cabin John Plan can only be used in huge developments. A R-90 cluster zoning will accomplish the same mixture of moderate priced townhouses and more expensive single family homes as was described in the Plan. Item #5 is an effort to consolidate all the commercial activity in Cabin John in one place. Item #6 will keep high-rise building out of Cabin John.

Items 7, 8, and 9 pertain to Seven Locks Road and its improvement. In #8, public testimony must make it clear that Cabin John residents desire a 24 foot wide road, and not a 36 foot wide one which is being proposed by the County. The bikeway in #9 will be constructed at no expense to the property owners along Seven Locks Road.

The hiker-biker trails proposed in #10 will help connect parts of Cabin John without roads at no expense to residents. #11 would give us central Canal access, and #12 would authorize a study to look into safer pedestrian crossing over the Union Arch Bridge.

Tomlinson Avenue is the one item where the Citizens of Cabin John must make a choice between alternatives on September 13. The planning people have given us five choices for the upper part of Tomlinson Avenue (begins off Persimmon Tree Rd. near the beltway). The last two choices (#15; d. and e.) would allow no direct road to connect upper Tomlinson Ave. with Seven Locks Rd. The other three choices are shown on the map which accompanies the zoning description. Alternatives 1 and 3 (15 a. and 15 c.) both would go through the Burgess Tract (#4 with the R-90 in the middle). In both cases the road would destroy the concept of mixed housing on that tract and would make single-family housing on that land difficult if not impossible. Alternative 2 (15 b.) would join the two sections of Cabin John with a road, would provide a road to the proposed park, but might be used as a commuter throughway to the Parkway.

Whatever the outcome of Tomlinson Ave.'s route is, it will be decided in great part on Sept. 13. Anyone who has an opinion on this or any of the other items on the agenda, should plan to be there on Sept. 13 at 8 p.m. and be heard.

Peter, the children, and I will already be in Maine by then, but I intend to put my opinion in writing and have it put into the record that way. Anyone who prefers writing to speaking can do the same thing. It must be submitted that night, however, or given to Minda Wetzel in advance.

I've subscribed to the Village News, so I'll keep in touch through that. We'll miss all of you, but will be back en masse next summer!

### NOTES FROM CLARA BARTON

Lunches for Clara Barton School, as well as three other area schools, are now being prepared in the Western Jr. High cafeteria and sent to Clara Barton. Orders for lunches for the day are given to Western Jr. High staff at 9:00 a.m. If your child will miss ordering lunch for the day, but will be at school for lunchtime, plan to pack a lunch for him or send his lunch money with another child.

The cost of a lunch (\$.50) is unchanged from last year as of now. Milk costs .10 for a carton.

For all children in grades 1 to 6 there is a 90 day grace period, until December 4, for providing the school with immunization records. It is imperative that the school have immunization records by that time.

The community four year old class will begin on September 17th and 18th, with three day weeks for the first two weeks.

Twenty Four Hour Fruit Salad With Custard Dressing

- 2 eggs
- 1/4 c. vinegar
- 1/4 c. sugar
- 2 Tbs. Margarine
- 2 Cups Sliced Peaches
- 2 Cups Pineapple Chunks
- 2 Oranges Peeled & Sectioned
- 1 Cup Seedless Grapes
- 4 Cups Tiny Marshmallows
- 1 Cup Heavy Cream, Whipped and Sweetened

Day before, prepare custard dressing in top of double boiler. Combine eggs, vinegar, and sugar. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly, until thickened and smooth. Remove from heat. Beat in margarine. Cool. Meanwhile, toss fruits lightly in serving dish. Add marshmallows; toss lightly. Fold cream and custard dressing into fruits. Refrigerate for 24 hours.



PRELIMINARY DRAFT AMENDMENT  
to the  
BETHESDA-CHEVY CHASE MASTER PLAN  
Cabin John Community

LAND USE AND ZONING

Convenience Commercial

1. Designate the block which includes the Touhey property and the fire house (bounded on the north by R-90 development and on the other three sides by 79th Street, MacArthur Boulevard, and Seven Locks Road) as a Convenience Commercial Center with C-1 zoning.
2. The developer of the Commercial Center should be encouraged to provide certain community amenities including:
  - a. Space for a bus stop, protected from the elements
  - b. Space to park a bookmobile
  - c. A family restaurant
  - d. A small food store
  - e. Compatible small shops
  - f. A small post office
  - g. Professional offices

Residential Areas

3. Retain the entire area south of MacArthur Boulevard and west of the west terminus of Ericsson Road as Single Family Residential with R-90 zoning.
4. Designate the 10.5 acre vacant tract located east of Buxton Terrace, north of a stream valley park and west of the Palisades Swim Club as a Single Family Residential with R-90 zoning and cluster development. This site should be acquired through the County's housing site acquisition fund for moderate cost housing.
5. Designate the C-1 zoned area at Tomlinson Avenue and MacArthur Boulevard as Single Family Residential and R-90 zoning.
6. Declare that single-family detached houses and townhouses are the only types of new housing which will harmonize with the established neighborhood. Whereas high-rise multi-family housing for the elderly is ordinarily permitted as a special exception, such development is contrary to planning policy

for the Cabin John Community.

#### TRANSPORTATION

##### Seven Locks Road

7. Reconfirm Seven Locks Road as a primary residential street.
8. The size of the road and the intersection designs will be evaluated after further study of needs in the area, taking into account transportation needs and the impact on the environment and the community.
9. Include a six-foot wide bikeway from River Road to MacArthur Boulevard.

##### Pathway System

The pathway system which has been programmed for the community should be extended as follows:

10. A hiker-biker trail should be extended westward from Seven Locks Road to serve the programmed local park, the housing site to be acquired by the County, and extend through the existing Little Brook Stream Valley Park. One spur should connect with the north terminus of 80th Place, and another spur should connect with the stream valley area owned by the homeowners association in the South Carderock area. Part of this bikeway may be located on Tomlinson Avenue.
11. A pathway should be required between MacArthur Boulevard and the C&O Canal property whenever the vacant property west of Ericsson Road is developed.
12. Consideration should be given to provision of a protected pedestrian crossing of MacArthur Boulevard over Cabin John Creek and Parkway. If feasible, this crossing should be provided in such a manner as not to detract from the historic and architectural merits of the Union Arch.

##### Tomlinson Avenue

13. The proposed route for a primary residential street between Persimmon Tree Road and MacArthur Boulevard should be made discontinuous.
14. Reclassify that part of existing Tomlinson Avenue between Seven Locks Road and MacArthur Boulevard as a local residential street. Delete the proposed rerouting over Tomlinson Terrace.
15. With respect to Tomlinson Avenue, which is now shown on the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Master Plan as a primary residential street between Persimmon Tree Road and Seven Locks Road, one of the following alternatives will be considered:
  - a. Terminate Tomlinson Avenue as a primary residential street at Seven Locks Road at a point between the Palisades Swim Club and the proposed local park.
  - b. Route Tomlinson Avenue as a primary residential street north of the proposed Seven Locks Road Local Park.
  - c. Retain Tomlinson Avenue as shown on the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Master Plan.
  - d. Retain present segments of Tomlinson Avenue but allow for no future connection.
  - e. Reclassify Tomlinson Avenue as a secondary residential street to be internally linked with future subdivision streets.

#### IMPLEMENTATION

16. Upon adoption of this Amendment, a sectional zoning map amendment should be adopted.
17. Accord special recognition to the citizens of the area whose planning values, desires, and proposals are embodied in the final draft report, Cabin John Community Plan, published in March 1973. While it is not in itself an official document, the report is hereby commended to public agencies and officials which are responsible for regulatory activities or which provide public facilities and services affecting the area.
