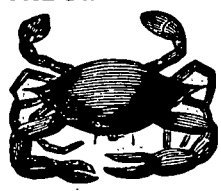

The canal has been dry between Locks 8 and 9 for over a year because a culvert beneath the canal upstream at Lock 12 collapsed, punching a hole in the canal prism and causing all the water to drain out. The Village

URGENT NOTICE: IF YOU ARE CONCERNED ABOUT 24-HOUR JET FLIGHTS
OUT OF NATIONAL AIRPORT, USING CABIN JOHN AS
THEIR DEPARTURE POINT AS THEY DO ALL DAY, YOU
MUST ACT, OR BE STUCK WITH THE CONSEQUENCES.

You may have read in the papers that Transportation Secretary Drew Lewis proposes tightening National Airport operations, to shorten the flight day and to quiet the jets. We have read the proposed rules, and find only more misery in them for Cabin John. The FAA is lying to us, and you must tell it so. Jets will be able to operate in and out of National 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The "curfew" based on times (7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.) will be replaced by one based on decibels. Any departing aircraft generating 72 decibels or less, and arriving aircraft generating 85 dBA or less, may operate any time. So that you may compare, "daytime" aircraft may generate 86 dBA. We can see no substantial difference in these noise levels.

When the wind is north, as it generally is, jets apply "increased climb power" and leave the Potomac on course to destination 10 miles from National, over Cabin John. That is the source of our noise problem. Under the proposed plan, jets will follow the same route at night as well. Thus our 15 to 18-hour noise problem will be a 24-hour problem.

-- UPSHOT --

The FAA, now even more in the grip of Congress and industry, proposes that a very little less noise for a much longer time is O.K. If you agree, stay silent. The jets won't, but you can. Cabin John is the decibel doormat to D.C., and if that doesn't bother you, just take it lying down.

But if you are tired of being overflowed, there is something you can do, and it is worth doing. The FAA has held hearings. We have testified. Our three voices will not count without your support. The FAA record will be "officially closed" on August 31, for written comments, but your comments should still be accepted if you get them in by the first week of September. The FAA is particularly interested in whether Cabin Johners are now bothered by aircraft noise at night.

Accordingly, you should state your objections firmly and directly, in no uncertain terms, in a simple letter to the FAA. If you now hear aircraft noise at night, please be sure to say so and that you do not want to hear more of the same. In addition to a night curfew, you should state that jet operations during the day should be drastically reduced. Also you should emphasize your support for a scatter plan, a test of which was recommended by the COG on May 13, 1981. Until and unless there is a scattering of jets, Cabin John will never receive any meaningful relief from jet noise.
