FREE SWIM PROGRAM TO BEGIN AT PALISADES POOL

Cabin John children will be able to swim free at the Palisades Pool from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays, beginning on Tuesday, June 22. No more than 75 children can be accomodated on any one day. Children unaccompanied by adults must be at least 6 years old.

On the first day that a child comes to swim, he or she must bring a permission note from his or her parent or guardian.
