## WHAT'S HAPPENING IN CABIN JOHN...

The Cabin John Post Office is promoting a mailbox improvement campaign that will make it easier for the mail carrier to deliver mail efficiently and thus speed up service. Roadside mailboxes should be located 3½ to 4 feet from the ground and must be reachable from the delivery jeep. Why not check out yours today and make sure it meets the standards?

In this connection, a new county ordinance (an amendment to the Fire Code) requires that house numbers on single family houses be at least five inches high. The previous rule was 3 inches in height, and houses with 3-inch-high numerals may keep them until they need replacement.

Cabin John residents will be part of an expanded Montgomery County recycling program. Currently the county collects newspapers every Friday; it will also pick up aluminum cans at the same time.

Under the expanded program the county will provide a recycling container to store recyclables and put them at curbside once a week for pickup. Items to be recycled will (Continued on page 2)

## ANNUAL CRAB FEAST TO BE HELD SEPTEMBER 10TH IN SEVEN LOCKS PARK



Advance tickets are now on sale for Cabin John's biggest community event -- the annual Crab and Chicken Feast.

The date this year is Saturday, September 10; the time is from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m.; and the place is Seven Locks Park, the county park just north of Palisades Pool off Seven Locks Rd.

As always, the event will feature Maryland steamed crabs and broiled chicken, plus a wonderful assortment of home-cooked vegetables. There is also a sale of delicious home-made baked goods. Soft drinks will be available for purchase (no beer this year, because the feast is on county property).

Organized games for children will be a special new feature of this year's event, and other entertainment is expected. The party will be held rain or shine, with a big shelter area to

provide cover if a thunderstorm breaks, as it did last year towards the end of the feast.

Dozens of volunteers are already signed up to help with the cooking, serving, and other preparations, but more are always needed! To volunteer to lend a hand, call Bob Greenberg, 229-5888.

Ticket sellers will be approaching every household during the weeks before the event.





School will also serve the Brookmont community.

The school has served Cabin John for twenty-five years. Meeting from 9 to 12:30 Monday thru Friday, the school enrolls 10 to 12 children. A teacher, Karen Burke, and an aide offer the children a wide range of activities, including trips to the store, museum or library.

In order to keep costs low (tuition is \$110 per month, with children bringing a bag lunch), parents are required to assist in many different jobs including fund raising, buying snacks, cleaning, painting, moving furniture, accompanying field trips, etc. Important decisions are made by consensus among the parents.
