COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT TO BE ON AGENDA FOR CABIN JOHN CITIZENS MEETING ON NOVEMBER 27

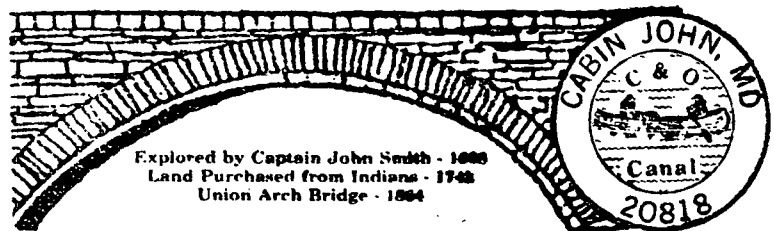
Two proposed commercial developments will be on the agenda at the next meeting of the Cabin John Citizens Association, according to Taffy Kingscott, Association president. The meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 27, at 8 p.m. at the Clara Barton Community Center.

Michael Garrett, owner of the MacArthur Plaza Shopping Center, will present to the community his plans for erecting an 11,000 square foot building which would not require zoning variances. Garrett's previous application for several zoning variances in order to construct a 16,000 square foot building was turned down by the County Board of Appeals after vigorous opposition by Cabin John citizens. Meanwhile, Postmaster LaVerne Baptist reminded everyone that complete addresses on their mail, including apartment or suite number, as well as zip code, would speed service and keep costs down. "Right now, 53% of letter mail processed in the Cabin John area is sorted on automatic scanning equipment," she said, and the goal is to have 100% automatically sorted by 1995.

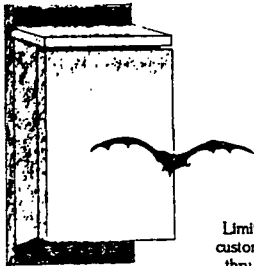

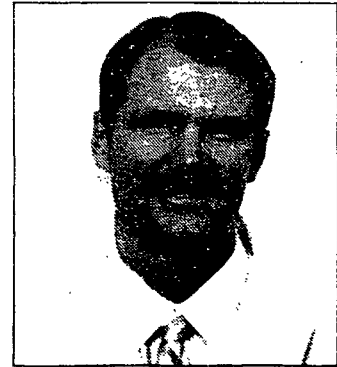
